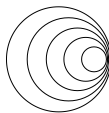

Item 5 has [N] new definitions: "Batch", "Carrier", "Commodity", "Consignee", "Destination", "Nomination", "Origin", "Shipper", "Supply Source", "Tanker", and "Tender". Mobil definition of "Company" in Rule 1 is [C] cancelled. It is replaced by the Buckeye definition of "Carrier" in Item 5.
2	Specifications Required	15, 110	Specification of Commodities	[N] New in Item 15: specifications for API gravity, viscosity, vapor pressure and color.
3	Storage, Origin and Destination Facilities	20	Destination facilities	[N] New in item 20: a minimum pressure of 50 P.S.I.G. is required, unless a lower pumping rate or pressure is designated.
4	Minimum Tender	25	Quantities Tendered at Origins	[W] Minor change in wording. The minimum batch size is unchanged at 10,000 barrels

5	Apportionment When Tenders Are in Excess of Facilities	90	Proration of Pipe Line Capacity	Language in Rule 5 is [C] cancelled and replaced by [N] new language in Item 90, which allocates based on historical volumes. Main points in Item 90 are as follows: Space is allocated by setting aside 2.5% of available capacity for each new shipper subject to a total of 10% of available capacity for all new Shippers. Allocations for Regular Shippers (Non-New Shippers) are based on the average historical volume during the defined 12 month period. Also included are binding nominations and penalties for failure to utilize the allocated space. Shippers must deliver 85% of the prorated binding nomination or be subject to the tariff rate times the deficient barrels.
6	Petroleum Products Involved in Litigation, Etc.	75	Title	[W] Minor change in wording. Item 75 states that acceptance of such commodities does not constitute a waiver or subordination of carriers lien.
7	Measuring, Testing and Deductions	45	Guaging, Metering, Testing and Deductions	[N] New in Item 45: Volumes corrected for pressure difference between observed value and zero P.S.I.G.
8	Identity of Petroleum Products	40	Identity Of and Mixing Of Commodities	[N] New in item 40: specific mention of segregated batches, allowing carrier to make delivery of substantially identical commodities, although carrier is permitted to make reasonable substitution of commodities having substantially the same specifications.
9	Split Deliveries	NA	NA	[C] Rule 9 is cancelled in its entirety.

10	Reconsignment	65	Diversion or Reconsignment	[W] Minor change in wording. Item 65 allows for diversion; this is not mentioned in rule 10.
11	Liability of Company	80	Liability of Carrier	[N] New in item 80: language added to include carrier liability excluded for any indirect, special, incidental or consequential damages, lost profit or other economic loss.
12	Payment of Transportation and Other Charges	50	Transportation Charges	[W] Change in wording in Item 50: Interest rate for past due balances charged at 4% over the prime interest rate.
13	Use of Communication facilities	NA	NA	[C] Rule 13 is cancelled in its entirety.
14	Claims, Suits, Time for Filing	85	Claims, Suits, Time for Filing	[W] Minor change in wording. Item 85 specifies "claims for loss or damage", while rule 14 only specifies "claims".
15	Terminal and Privilege Rules	55	Application of Rates	[W] Minor change in wording. Item 85 refers to the date commodity is received, which replaces language in rule 15 referencing the date of shipment.
16	Pipage Contracts	70	Separate Pipeline Agreements	[W] Minor change in wording. Item 70 specifically references separate agreements in association with pipeline connections.
17	Line Fill and Tank Bottom Inventory	120	Line Fill and Tank Bottom Inventory	[W] Minor change in wording. Item 120 references settlement based upon prevailing prices in the carrier's area of operation, and removes the reference to Platts found in rule 17.

	30	Minimum Deliveries [N] New. Item 30 establishes a minimum delivery to any destination of 5,000 barrels.
	35	Buffer Material [N] New. Shipper may be required to provide buffer material.
	60	Application of Rates From and To Intermediate Points [N] New. Item 60 defines appropriate tariff rate to use if commodities are received or delivered at points unnamed in existing tariffs.
	95	Charge for Spill Compensation Acts and Regulations [N] New. In the event any tax, fee or levy is imposed by government for the purpose of creating a fund related to spills, carrier will assess a charge on shippers in the same amount.
	100	Time and Method for Submitting Nominations [N] New. Nominations for any given month are required by the 15th calendar day of the preceding calendar month. Nominations must be submitted using carriers electronic commerce system unless otherwise instructed by carrier.
	105	Confirmation of Supply Source [N] New. Shippers need to confirm the supply source (receipt tanker) a minimum of 3 working days prior to delivering the commodity.
	115	Disposition of Commodities on Failure to Accept Delivery [N] New. Item 115 applies if shipper fails to make adequate arrangements for delivery of product. Carrier will allow diversion or reconsignment of product; however, penalty fees for rescheduling, storage, and line shut down (if applicable) can be assessed by carrier.
